There are fewer Masons today—by nearly a million—than there were in 1941 as the country came out of the Great Depression. The Elks have 900,000 members, down from 1.6 million in 1980. Rotary clubs have dropped nearly 42,000 since 1995 in the USA to 360,790 last year. At what point is all this not recoverable? Could this current recession actually be good for fraternities and social organizations? As people have harder and harder times getting jobs, is the networking available through fraternities and other social groups a way for people to

find work? I know Freemasonry had a big influx after WWII, when the military returned home and had to find a way to get back into the social fabric of their communities, often as part of their search for work or advancement in the workplace. I suspect a fraternity is a good place to network and find work. And what better way to find good advice, than the council of a good man, a Master Mason! I attempted a couple of years ago to start a business network here at Sahib, we met weekly for awhile for lunch in the Sahib restaurant, but like most such efforts BizNet died. Scottish Rite

In the 23rd degree of Scottish Rite, Chief of the Tabernacle, the jewel is a small silver censor or ornamental cup. It is used to remind us to offer up to God the incense of good deeds and charitable actions dedicated by a pure and upright heart.

The use of incense as part of worship was common to all nations in ancient times. The Hebrews, Hindus and Egyptians used it for no purposes other than worship. In some parts of the Persian Empire, it was burnt before the king. In some of the ancient temples where animal sacrifices were conducted, incense was used to conceal odors arising from the remains and its use evolved into a ceremonial rite and became itself a symbol of worship, especially of prayer. It is spoken of in both the Old and New Testaments as a symbol of prayer. Thus the Psalmist said in Psalm 141, vs., "let my prayer be counted as incense before thee and the lifting up of my hands as an evening sacrifice."

The scent from the incense also allows us to receive the smell which is closely associated with our

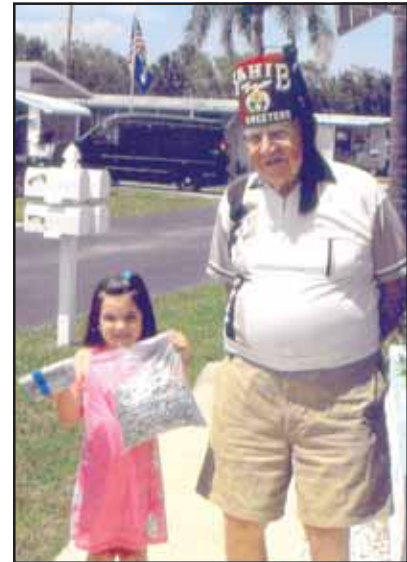

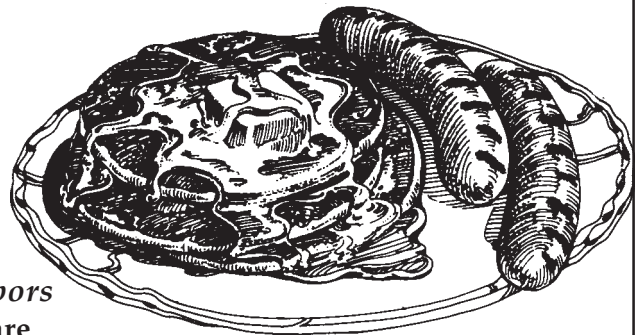

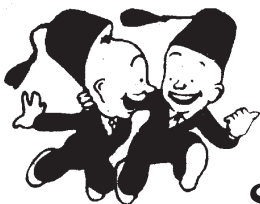
