




# **Hospital Transportation Notes**

Perception is not always reality. Our thoughts as to Hospital Transportation dealing with Tampa General Hospital (TGH) were skeptical at best. The first, second, and third contacts changed that idea. TGH is a big league facility and has its act together. We have had three patient trips in and out plus a drivers' familiarization trip and all have ended well. Something as basic as signs and floor markings are accurate and on point. There are still a few loose ends that need tying up. Patients, as we handle them with transportation, are not a norm for TGH so there are some communication glitches that need work. Shriners Healthcare will be using TGH for more outsourcing such as MRI's, similar equipment specialties, as well as surgeries, so our contacts will increase. Among other things they have Mickey D's, Starbucks, and a full-choice food court all on the ground floor, at typical street prices and reasonable proximity. TGH is in constant motion with people moving in and out, where the clinic is an 8:00 to 5:00 operation at best.

There are a number of stories going around about the building at SCH-Florida (the clinic) and include: down staffing, UCF no longer needs it, Moffitt wants it. We know nothing—that is for sure. The POPS manufacturing shop has now moved to the Tampa Airport building. The fit-ups and local patient measuring will still be at SCH-Florida. Being near the airport is much more convenient for the out-of-town patients coming in.

There is so much grousing that goes on at Sahib it is easy to get caught up in it if you are not careful. From the positive side, the Potentate's Ball came off as a class event. 98% of the attendees were very well satisfied and pleased with the food, the beverages, and the entertainment. *Johnnie Thinwallet* pretty much sat on the sidelines for this one. It is easy to forget we have a public image well beyond the in-house nit picking and second guessing.



The drivers' presence at TGH on February 7th was not a big, planned deal, was not announced, and yet really drew positive attention and respect. People recognize Shriners. It turned out to be a real ego boost as Shriners. We do not have a tarnished image to clean up, we're already the "Good Guys" and we need to run that puppy around the track as many times and as often as we can. The drivers were wearing their fezzes and Sahib logo shirts and all standing tall as Shriners. We got a number of "thanks for what you do."

Going back to an early *Reporter* article, a poll was taken in the Chicago area and the Shriner's Fez was the number one recognized symbol—not the bell, not the bucket, not the chimney, nor any other local things—just the Fez.



## **Masonic Digest / Scottish Rite**

Albert Pike (1809-1891) remarked that "...nothing can be done with those who accept literally the legend of Hiram and of the building and rebuilding the Temple." His statement reminds us that Freemasonry, in its rituals, ceremonies and writings, is not intended to offer a history lesson. It instructs us in the moral virtues and aims to improve our character and conduct. We are supposed to learn something – but it is not history.



The Symbolic Lodge, in Pike's view, is an introduction to that "something." It reviews the four cardinal and three theological virtues, our principal tenets and the necessity of obedience, education, secrecy, loyalty and integrity. Each of these ideas or principles, while they serve to bind us as an organization, is common to other fraternal organizations. The instruction of the Blue Lodge is not necessarily unique to Freemasonry.

For this reason, Pike classified the Symbolic Lodge as the Lesser Mysteries. He asserted that the Lodge of Perfection, which

includes the 4th through 14th degrees, "...completes and perfects the Third Degree" because its degrees examine the philosophical, political, religious, mystical, intellectual, and moral meanings of the Hiramic Legend.

Pike regarded the Lodge of Perfection as the next leg of our journey toward the Higher Mysteries. Its degrees explore, and more thoroughly examine, the symbols of the Blue Lodge. It considers the teachings of Socrates, Confucius, Zoroaster, Cicero, and Mohammad, as well as those of many teachers found in the Volume of Sacred Law. Such a thorough endeavor is uncommon to other fraternal organizations. He suggests, therefore, that our journey, our learning, must continue after our raising.

Our journey is not so simple as captured in the first three degrees.

The Hiramic Legend is *not* history, not even close; it is a Legend intended to reveal *and conceal* real Truths. It represents an initial stage in our journey of self-examination, self-development, discovery, and reflection.


Our journey commences in the Blue Lodge and continues into the Scottish Rite.

The Scottish Rite meets at its Center in Tampa on the second Monday of each month at 7:00 p.m., preceded by a 5:45 p.m. dinner.

Prior to the regular Consistory meeting on March 9th at 6:10 p.m., the 6th degree, Confidential Secretary, is scheduled to be conferred. At the regular meeting, an educational program considering the 13th degree, Royal Arch of Solomon, will be presented by your writer. The 13th degree will be conferred on July 13th.

## **Disability Awareness: Words Matter**



Children with disabilities, like all children, will learn or absorb what they are taught and react to the way they are treated. Every staff member at Shriners Hospitals for Children works hard to build confidence and self-esteem in their patients, and to help them discover and pursue their dreams, despite their disabilities. In working with kids toward that goal, it's important to remember how language can affect a positive attitude.

Words to avoid include "crippled" and "handicapped." Instead of using these words, which can be considered negative, experts suggest using "disability" or the actual term involved, such as "cerebral palsy" or "muscular dystrophy."

When speaking about people with disabilities, clear, direct words are most positively accepted. For example, say, "Johnny uses a wheelchair," instead of, "Johnny is wheelchair-bound," or, "Johnny is confined to a wheelchair." Wheelchairs allow mobility from place to place, which is the opposite of confining.

Words and tone-of-voice can clearly indicate values, and using positive, affirmative words can make a big difference. Practice care when using value-laden words like courageous, inspiration, pity, suffer, tragic, tragedy, afflicted or victim. While courageous and inspirational may seem positive, being labeled as such can be burdensome to a child.

It is also important to use "people-first language." For example, saying, "Johnny is a *child with a disability*," is preferred over saying, "Johnny is a *disabled child*." People with disabilities sometimes

feel isolated from those without disabilities and left out of activities. People-first language is an attempt to encourage understanding that people with disabilities are people first, and to help alleviate fear and encourage inclusion.

#### Conversation Starters

Here are some ways to start a conversation with a person who has a disability: Say hello; introduce yourself; comment on the weather. Find something you might share an interest in – television, music, sports, anything. In short, begin the same way you would if there were no disability. Take a deep breath, look past the obvious difference, and find the person.

When you speak to people with disabilities as people, you will find yourself in a conversation with someone who has had different experiences, and the exchange of views could be very enriching for both of you.

If you are interested in finding out more about the person's disability, understand that everyone with a disability reacts to this differently and, like most subjects, there are appropriate and inappropriate ways – and times and places – to ask such questions.

Try using words that reflect acceptance and indicate that a person is not defined by their disability – a message that is especially imperative to convey to children with disabilities.

Crippled, handicapped
Confined to a wheelchair
Wheelchair-bound
Suffering from, afflicted with
Victim
Deformed

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) on PULL TABS



- Why not collect the whole can? Collecting complete cans would require a great deal more storage space. You should go ahead and recycle the rest of the can in the normal way, in the dumpster behind Sahib.
- 2. How many tabs in a pound? 1,267.
- How many tabs will a gallon milk jug hold? About 5 pounds worth
- I. How does it work and where does the money go? The tabs are delivered to the Sahib office (or almost any Sahib club/unit location) and then taken to the recycling center. The money netted from recycling goes directly into the "Wheel Chair Repair Fund" at the Tampa Shriners Hospital for Children.

#### Where are the boxes to be?


In any store or business, preferably near a cash register. Within eyesight of customers making it easy for them to put their change in the box.
